Down Memory Lane

It's been 145 years but let me try to tell you a little bit about what the women of Faith, that lived their lives with arms and hearts wide open in God's service, accomplished. Around 1879 the Ladies Aid Society was formed and dedicated to service, albeit to the church itself. The ladies did set aside 2 cents a week for missions. Later mission-oriented groups were established: "Farther Lights", "Kings Daughters", "Lend-a-Hand". In 1891 the ladies rallied together and raised money to purchase the building next to the church for a parsonage. White Cross began in 1920 to provide supplies for missionaries which became important during and after World War II. In 1945-46 the ladies reported they were unable to get material for White Cross work and therefore a very few of them made <u>only</u> 15 pairs of hospital boots, 11 girls dresses, 21 pajamas, 54 boys' shirts and 5 baby layettes.

Time moved on and ladies' groups became Women's Circles named Evening Circle, Friendship Circle and InAsMuch Circle. A group began the Clothing Center in the basement of the church (old Boy Scout room) for gently used clothing available to the community for a small cost of usually 25 cents. Another group visited the Binghamton Psychiatric Center once a month to bring love and cheer to otherwise forgotten patients. White Cross work continued to be a large part of the Circle programs until a few years ago. Now it's easier for missionaries to purchase needed items on-line.

In 1999 a tea was held for recognition in faithfulness of the members of the Women's Society with 30 years of service. Two of those members remain: Joan Gibbs and Daisy Fritz, now with 55 years of service. Forty-two (42) members attended that tea. Now times and needs have changed again.

The Evening and Friendship Circle combined to the Sunshine Circle which Peggy Kirch chaired for over 21 years until it disbanded in May, 2024.

"Many thanks, Peggy, for all your years of leading the women in service and ministry to people."

In September the InAsMuch Circle will resume on the Second Wednesday of the month, at 10:30 a.m. in the Spot (back entrance). At 11:30 a.m. the women will enjoy lunch and continue in fellowship at the Parkview. All women are welcome and invited to join in this Circle.

May we continue in Faith to keep our arms and hearts wide open in whatever lies before us as we continue to serve our heavenly Father.




Circles of Concern: 2nd Wednesday of the month in the middle room of the SPOT from Sept to May
